WHEREAS, Many Filipinos are devout Roman Catholics with strong devotion to the miraculous image of the Santo Nino, and

WHEREAS, This devotion began with Philippine discovery and Christianization in 1521 when Spanish explorer, Ferdinand Magellan gave an image of Jesus (as a child) to the Queen of the island of Cebu. The image was praised with a dance called the Sinulog, and

WHEREAS , Throughout the 16^{th} century, many occurrences were experienced and documented by both new devotees of the Church, and were attributed to the Santo Nino, and

WHEREAS, The celebration is a reminder of Christ's coming with passion and mercy; the Fiesta will honor the Holy Child, Jesus. Mass will be celebrated by Rev. Michael F. Gutgsell and Rev. John J. Comiskey at St. Cecilia's.

Now Therefore, I Jean Stothert, Mayor of the City of Omaha, do hereby proclaim January 15, 2017 as

Cofradia del Sto. Niño de Cebu National Level (Philippines)

(From the Constitutions and By-Laws of the Cofradia del Santo Niño de Cebu (National Level)

I = About the Cofradia

The Cofradia del Sto. Niño de Cebu is a public association of the Filipino Augustinians which aims to spread the devotion to the Sto. Niño de Cebu around the country and to some parts of the world. It has its mother chapter in the Basilica Minore del Sto. Niño de Cebu in Cebu City and local chapters were established in every Augustinian community of the Province and other parishes in the country.

II = Mission and goal of the Cofradia

- a. To sanctify its members and their families through the devotion to Santo Niño, a sincere practice of their faith, frequent reception of the Sacraments, charitable works and social apostolate;
- b. To help promote and propagate the devotion to the Holy Child Jesus throughout the Philippines, that our people may receive the graces they need to preserve and keep vital the Catholic faith in our country;
- c. To promote mutual assistance and cooperation among the membership of the Cofradia;
- d. To engage the Cofradia in religious and civic community activities, for the upliftment of our people..

The various Chapters may further include other specific objectives in their Statutes, consonant with the objectives of the Cofradia.

Appendix

As a means to achieve its objectives, the Cofradia has adopted a general program of activities and practices which will be followed and implemented by all Chapters, with allowance for the circumstances of place and the available facilities. Each Chapter may add other activities and practices proper to the place, provided they are in consonance with the nature and objectives of the Cofradia.

Celebrations and Devotions



a. Feast of Santo Niño

The annual feast in honor of Santo Niño will generally be celebrated on the third Sunday of January and will mark the highlight of the yearly activities of the Cofradia. Consequently, no efforts will be spared to make this celebration a success. Ideally, the celebration ought to be held in close relation with all other activities of the Cofradia.

b. Commemoration of the discovery of the Image

The commemoration of the discovery of the image of Santo Niño will be cele brated on April 28 with appropriate religious, social and civic activities.

c. The Perpetual Novena

Attendance to, or recitation of, the Novena every Friday will be mandatory for every member of the Cofradia.

III = HISTORY = The image

Most images venerated in Christendom have had their origins in unverifiable legend. This, of course, does not in any manner detract from the validity of the devotion of the people and from the authenticity of many of the miracles attributed to the images, for the image is but the symbol or visible sign of the reality for which they stand.

It is the same infant Jesus whom we adore when we kneel before one or another of His images, and our preferences for one image over another is justified by reasons which have to do with our inclinations, our needs, our inheritance or our place, just as the reverence of the theologian or the intellectual or the uneducated, of the grown up as well as of the child, is justified not only because we all, even in our religion, must see and feel and touch but also because we are duty-bound to worship not only with our souls but also with our senses.

The image of the Santo Niño of Cebu did not come to us shrouded in the mist of legend: its origin and discovey and the sequence of events that caused its presence in Cebu have long been as well documented as any fact in the history of our country's past can be. Still, there was in that sequence a touch of the romantic that makes the story worth telling once more, and there was in the discovery of the image of a proof to the weary Spaniards that all would yet be well in a land and among people that at first appeared anything but hospitable and cordial.

In truth, and for reasons the Spaniards could not fathom, all seemed to have gone wrong on that 28 April 1565 when the men of Miguel Lopez de Legazpi lit upon the beaches of Cebu. The encounter between the unfriendly inhabitants and the alien soldiers did not augur well, and Legazpi, man of peace and of prudent ways, caused the Augustinian Andres de Urdaneta land with the soldiers to attempt prevent a fight between the wary inhabitants and the soldiery, frazzled of nerves and warlike in mood after the long passage from Mexico. No one knows who provoked the fire, but much of the town was destroyed, and the population took to the hills behind. The usual search of the remaining houses ensued, but nothing of value was to be found in any, except for one in which one of the sailors hit upon a chest bound with a cord which clearly was of Spanish make. Inside the chest a second box was found and in it a statuette clad in velvet and with a red cap on its head. Two fingers of the right had of the statue were raised and extended as in blessing, and the left hand held a gilded globe. The image was obviously well preserved, with "just the tip of the nose rubbed off somewhat and the skin coming off its face", and it was clear that, for whatever reasons, the image had been kept with the care afforded an object considered sacred.

Veterans of European campaigns easily identified the statue as an effigy of the Holy child Jesus, most likely of the Flemish variety, and those familiar with religious practices remembered that the devotion to the Holy Child, increasingly popular in Spain from the beginning of the 16th century, had fast spread to other countries in Europe, including the Netherlands which at the time was one of the realms of the King of Spain. It was further noticed that the customary cross was missing from the gilded globe; but there was no question that the image was Christian, and when it was brought to Legazpi he knelt before it, took it in his hands, kissed it, and proclaimed before his men that the finding of the statue was indeed an auspicious omen, announcing further that the grounds where it had been found and the surrounding area would be reserved for a church and monastery in which the Holy Child would thenceforth be enshrined for the veneration of all the future generations.

IV=About the devotion to the Sto. Niño

It has been assumed of late in certain quarters, especially after Vatican Council II, that devotional practices, as distinguished from the Mass, the sacraments, and the strictly ecclesial liturgy, should be discouraged. It was assumed, long before Vatican II, by certain people, no doubt dedicated and well minded, that religion in the Philippines had early acquired and long preserved a sentimental, ritual ridden nature whose supersession was overdue. The premise and the contention underlying both assumptions are that religion, even as practiced by ordinary people, should be based on and limited to essential theology.

THE HISTORY OF THE COFRADIA DEL SANTO NINO DE CEBU GREATER OMAHA METRO AREA CHAPTER



In the Philippines and around the world, the vast majority of the Filipino people are devout Roman Catholics with strong devotion to the Miraculous Image of the Holy Child Jesus (Santo Niño). This devotion traces its roots from the first days of Philippine Christianization in 1521 and throughout the 16th century when many occurrences which both new devotees and Church could only attribute to the divine powers of the Santo Niño were experienced and documented.

In Nebraska, Johnny Rivera, with the inspiration of his mother the late Consuelo Tan Rivera and in consultation with the late Reverend Rafael B. Librea, saw the need to organize the pioneering group of metro Omaha's Santo Niño devotees.

On April 4, 1986, coinciding with the universal Catholic observance of First Friday of the month in dedication to the Sacred Heart of Jesus when the religious gather their family to pray together, these Santo Nino devotees elected the first set of officers of the Cofradia del Santo Niño de Cebu – Greater Omaha Metro Area with Mr. Rivera as President as well as to designate and recognize Father Librea as Spiritual Director, which later has permanently and continuously held to to his death in November 2013, After Father Librea's death, Father John Comiskey has become our new Spiritual Director.

PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES

The purpose and objectives of the Cofradia are the following:

- 1. To promote devotion to the Holy Child Jesus (Santo Nino)
- 2. To preserve and enhance the Catholic faith
- 3. To maintain relationship and interaction among other religious institutions towards successful attainment of common organizational visions and goals.
- 4. To preserve the values, customs and traditional practices of the Philippine Catholic Culture.
- 5. To promote mutual assistance and cooperation among the membership.
- 6. To provide assistance to other Catholic charitable causes and community works.
- 7. To foster loyalty to the United States of America and to promote its principles

- 2. Celebrate Nine Novena masses on nine Fridays preceding the Fiesta.

WHAT IS SINULOG?

The word Sinulog comes from the <u>Cebuano</u> adverb sulog which roughly means "like water current movement;" it describes the forward-backward movement of the Sinulog dance. The dance consists of two steps forward and one step backward, done to the sound of drums. The dance is categorized into Sinulog-base, Free-Interpretation, and street dancing. Candle vendors at the Basilica continue to perform the traditional version of the dance when lighting a candle for the customer, usually accompanied by songs in the native language.

Sinulog is the ritual prayer-dance honoring Señor Santo Niño or the Child Jesus. An image of the Child Jesus is said to be the baptismal gift the Portuguese conquistador Ferdinand Magellan gave Hara Amihan (Humanay) of Zebu (now Cebu) in April 1521. The Sinulog dance moves are basically two steps forward and one step backward as the dancer sways to a distinct rhythm of drums. This movement resembles the current (Sulog) of what was known as Cebu's Pahina River.

According to historical accounts, the Zebu natives already danced the Sinulog in honor of their animist idols long before the arrival of Magellan who led a Spanish expedition on April 7, 1521. Magellan did not live long after he introduced Christianity. He died in a failed assault on nearby Mactan island at the hands of a local chieftain named Lapu-Lapu. Survivors of Magellan's expedition left behind the image to be discovered 44 years later.

Today, the Sinulog commemorates the Filipino people's acceptance of Christianity (specifically, Roman Catholicism), and their rejection of their former animist beliefs. The first of these conversions happened in 1521 on the island of Cebu, when Rajah Humabon and his queen Amihan (Humamay) were baptized along with their subjects, becoming Carlos and Juana of Cebu.

On April 15, 1521, the <u>Portuguese</u> explorer <u>Ferdinand Magellan</u> arrived and planted the cross on the shores of Cebu, claiming the territory for <u>Spain</u>.



He presented the image of the child <u>Jesus</u>, the <u>Rajah Humabon</u>. Hara Humamay (or Amihan in some versions) was later named, Queen Juana in honor of Juana, mother of <u>Carlos I</u>. Along with the rulers of the island, some 800 natives were also baptized to the Roman Catholic Church. At the moment of receiving the holy

This event is frequently used as basis for most Sinulog dances, which dramatize the coming of the Spaniards and the presentation of the Santo Niño to the Queen. A popular theme among Sinulog dances is Queen Juana holding the Santo Niño in her arms and using it to bless her image, it was said that Queen Juana danced with joy bearing this image of the child Jesus. With the other natives following her example, this moment was regarded as the first Sinulog.

Since 1925, the Columban Fathers have been blessed to call the Philippines home. We celebrate the Feast of Santo Niño de Cebu with you and pray that your new year is filled with blessings.

CONTRACEPTION FACTS

A Contraceptive is supposed to prevent conception, not produce an abortion. Yet the truth about these drugs is that all of them can and do cause abortions.

<u>Oral Contraceptives</u> allow fertilization to occur at a rate of 2-10% of the time. They cause the lining of the uterus to become inhospitable to the developing baby who literally dies from lack of nourishment and is aborted.

<u>IUDs</u> work by interfering with the enzymatic processes of the developing baby and by inflaming the lining of the uterus, making it inhospitable to implantation.

Norplant consists of six-one inch long silastic rods implanted in the arm and contains the progestin, *levonorgestrel*, which acts for 5 years. There are approx. 1,500,000 users. At a 50-65% ovu1ation rate times a 25% conception rate, this amounts to between 2-3 million chemical abortions per year.

<u>Depo-Provera</u> works-the same way. It is injected under the skin every 3 months. Based on an estimated 1 million users and an ovu1ation rate of 40- 60%, it has been determined that at the lower rate there are 400,000 ovulatory cycles times a 25% conception rate yielding about 100,000 chemica1 abortions per cycle or 1,200,000 per year.

Breast Cancer and abortion

In the U.S., women under age 45 who have had abortions may have a 50% higher risk of breast cancer, according to a study reported in the

Journal of the National Cancer Inst. The risk is more than doubled for women under 18 who have abortions.

engagements. In 1995, the Vatican recognized his efforts by inviting him to a congress for pro-life issues in Rome. Planned Parenthood Federation of America's own data for 1994-95 indicated that it made nearly \$110,000,000 per year selling birth control products.

PP creates a demand for these products via the sex ed it promotes in schools, says Sedlak. As promiscuity thus rises, so does the number of unintended pregnancies due to contraceptive failure. PP then turns

to surgical abortion as a backup. Also, the so-called contraceptive drugs & devices PP profits from act, a significant




